Withdrawing Students from a Module

If a student is going to withdraw from a module, this should be flagged at modular level and not at individual component level. SAINT Users should use NN or SS (and ***not W***) for any components. A student is withdrawn from a module by entering a module grade of W when agreeing marks.

Note:

SAINT will allow users to enter the flag W (withdrawn) at component level [figure 1]

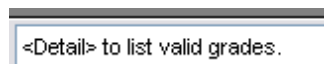


Figure 2 – warning message when a flag of W is entered at component level

But when you TAB away from the field, a warning comes up at the bottom of the screen [figure 2]

This is saying that W is not a valid grade at component level. Unfortunately the system will allow you to store this grade.

This is causing problems on BRAD e.g. a module with 3 components can have marks in 2 of the components and 0.00 W in 1 component. BRAD will show 0.00 W against the student and ignore the marks and weighting on the other components.
