Introduction to forensic archaeology. Principles of search and excavation of clandestine burials. Police structures and the management of an investigation. Establishing identity. Establishing time since death. Case studies.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
<p>The module will be presented as a series of lectures that will introduce the application of forensic archaeology to crime scene investigation. The module will culminate in a day long practical exercise that will demonstrate different aspects of archaeological involvement in search and recovery of human remains.</p> <p>The Assessment will consist of CW 1 (stratigraphy worksheet (20%) and CW a paper based role playing exercise (80%)</p> <p>CW 2 consists of a paper-based, role playing scenario in which the candidate is presented with a developing case on which they are required to provide strategy advice and interpretation of the evidence. Formal feedback is available through canvas</p> <p>During Directed Study hours students are expected to undertake reading to consolidate and expand on the content of formal taught sessions; research and prepare for assessments; revise material from formal taught sessions; and undertake specific elements of reading as directed</p>
