Emphasis is placed on the use of case studies and reflections by you on your own working experience (LO 6).</p> <p>Formative assessment will be undertaken through feedback on unassessed workshop exercises, and also on draft outlines of the group and individual assignments where requested.</p> <p>Summative assessment will be through an individual coursework assignment which allows you to revise, apply and demonstrate specific project implementation management knowledge and competences (LO 1,2,3,4, and 7). The assessment assesses the achievement of all Learning Outcomes.</p>
