Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

Key material will be delivered through an on-campus lecture programme, supplemented via online group seminars and directed reading which will be made available on the virtual learning environment (VLE). Students will be provided with worksheets which have focused questions they have to complete before the online seminar session which will consolidate their learning.

Learning aims are assessed via a seminar presentation and an essay on research findings. Supplementary assessment is repair deficiency.
