Module Aims

To develop and critically utilise advanced knowledge and skills to evaluate of an aspect of service delivery relevant to an area of their professional practice.

Outline Syllabus

Guidance on selecting and using literature and designing research study; Advanced literature search skills, Critical appraisal skills for literature. Critiquing current professional practices and services and identifying areas for evaluation and improvement; evaluating and selecting appropriate methodology; development of skills in data and information collection, organisation and analysis; interpretation and evaluation of research findings; impact of findings on service delivery, practice or patient care/outcomes; discussion, dissemination and writing for publication the process and findings. Developing time/ project management skills; professional development.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

A blended learning approach will be taken to the delivery of the module content. Research informed lectures will explore in depth the key elements of undertaking a clinical project including developing bespoke competencies LO 1-2. Students will be allocated a supervisor who will advise and guide them through the project LO 2-5. Students will be expected to direct their own study whilst undertaking the service evaluation using the online resources available LO 6-8.

Feedback on progress will be provided either through electronic communication or individual tutorials.

Assessment mode 2, a student choice of a journal article or a conference poster, will assess LO 4-9. Assessment mode 1, a service evaluation, will assess LO 1-8.
