BIC5001-B module aims

This module provides an introduction to key principles of business law and ethical practice in both national and international contexts. Students examine the legal environment in which businesses operate, including contract law, company law and the regulation of employment and commerce. Alongside this, the module explores frameworks for ethical decision-making and considers the impact of globalisation, corporate responsibility and sustainability. Through case studies and discussion, students build the legal awareness and moral reasoning needed for effective and responsible business practice.

This module aligns with the FHEQ Level 5 descriptors, ensuring that students demonstrate analytical understanding and apply key principles to defined contexts. It is mapped to the QAA Subject Benchmark Statement for Business and Management (2019), particularly in relation to legal awareness, ethical behaviour, and the regulatory context of business activity. The module also reflects the CIPD and CMI competencies in business ethics and corporate governance, and introduces legal terminology and reasoning frameworks relevant to business practice. Case-based learning supports the development of problem-solving and critical judgement, in line with expectations for progression to Level 6 study.

BIC5001-B module learning, teaching and assessment

Teaching is delivered through interactive seminars and workshops that combine tutor-led input with case study analysis, small-group discussion and structured tasks. Students are supported to explore legal and ethical principles by applying them to real-world scenarios and contemporary business issues. The module encourages debate and critical reflection on diverse perspectives. Formative activities and regular feedback are embedded to help students develop confidence with legal terminology, ethical reasoning and academic communication. Independent study and guided reading support students in preparing for final-year study and professional contexts. The module is assessed through a two-hour written exam, which tests students' knowledge of legal principles, their ability to apply law to business scenarios, and their capacity to analyse ethical issues in legal and business contexts. The exam includes a mix of short-answer questions, scenario-based problem-solving, and a longer evaluative response.

Formative preparation includes practice questions, case study discussions and sample exam tasks with feedback. Students receive guidance on how to construct legal arguments and apply legal terminology effectively.

This assessment and feedback strategy supports the IY2 programme's focus on independent learning, critical thinking, and transition to final-year undergraduate study in a UK higher education context.
